10) 9:25 AM Review and approve Steve Regan Co. Invoice for improvements at the fairgrounds

9:25 AM **Motion and Action:** Approve the Steve Regan Invoice for improvements at the fairgrounds in the amount of \$30,250.94 as presented, **Moved by** Kent R. Searle - Member, **Seconded by** Bob Kunau - Member. Motion passed unanimously.

11) 9:36 AM Review and approve FY2026 Burley Highway District invoice (\$97,969.02)

- a) The invoice is for \$97,969.02.
- b) Albion Highway District was also unaware of the substantial increase of \$17,500.00 being requested for this year. They had planned to increase from their current amount of \$12,500.00 to \$15,000.00 starting in FY2027 for two years and then a second increase to \$17,500.00 after that.
- c) 11:06 AM The matter will be tabled for another week while additional information is obtained from the Albion Highway District.

12) 9:41 AM Law Enforcement Contract with City of Burley for 2026-2027

- a) It was reported that the Sheriff and Prosecuting Attorney worked together on this contract.
- b) The City's base payment of \$2,355,586.33 is an increase of 1.57% over last year with additional one-time funding of \$75,000.00 for the purchase of one additional vehicle, totaling the amount to \$2,430,586.33.
- c) That amount is to be divided into twelve monthly payments of \$202,548.86.
- d) The County's contribution was calculated at a 2% increase over last year.

- a) A property compensation estimate of \$5,846.77 was given for the corner on 600 East Main Street.
- b) The estimate seems satisfactory to move the History Museum sign and possible fencing needs. Any remaining funds would go into the county's general fund.

14) 9:39 AM Review and discuss Second Revised Howell Canyon Road Maintenance Agreement

- a) The proposed contract sent indicates for June 1, 2026, Cassia County would contribute \$81,018.00 base. As discussed in item number 11, both the county and Albion Highway District planned for smaller increases over the next few years.
- b) 10:10 AM revisited. There were no issues from a legal standpoint. The questions are from a policy standpoint of the amount to be paid and when that amount is to be paid. They have it scheduled to increase 3% starting FY2028 through to FY2030.

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- c) 11:07 AM The matter will be discussed again next week after more discussion with Albion Highway District regarding their concerns.

- b) The software is only for one year. If the evaluation of the performance of the equipment and software is positive, then the county could consider renewing the software license at \$1,000.00 per year.
- c) The equipment costs \$5,500.00 and the installation costs \$2,500.00 for a total of \$8,000.00, which is the amount of the grant awarded.

21) 10:03 AM Discuss adding Employee Random Drug Testing to Policy and Procedures

- a) SIF informed the Auditor's Office that the County is eligible to receive an additional 5% discount on the County's insurance policy if a random drug testing policy and a new hire drug testing policy were applied to the whole county. It was noted that law enforcement had already implemented those two policies.
- b) The estimated discount savings is \$7,006.85.
- c) McMurray mentioned that Idaho Code protected some employees of the County from random drug tests and that the policy was meant for employees in safety positions such as law enforcement who are authorized to carry a gun.
- d) The County would have to implement policy changes, obtain a certificate from Urgent Care of Idaho as our current drug tester facility, and provide a letter asserting implementation of the new policies.
- e) Deputy Auditor Michelle Wallace was tasked to obtain additional information relating to constitutionally protected rights of employees to see if there were any conflicts with SIF's proposed discounts.

- a) Construction project status report was given. The second half of the second-floor concrete was poured this morning.

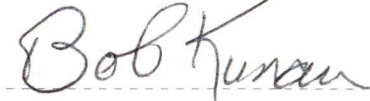
